

Ms Maduba is the founder and Director of Maduba Attorneys Incorporated based in Bloemfontein. She is specializing among others, in civil, criminal litigation and corporate governance advisory services, on her own account since January 2013. She holds a B. Proc. from the University of Transkei as well as a Certificate in Leadership Development (CPLD) from Wits Business School. She was admitted as an

Attorney in May 2000 and has been practicing since then. She seats in the Audit and Risk Committee of the Free State Law Society and well as the Chairperson of the Legal Aid Committee of the LSSA. She has served as a Principal to a number of Candidate Attorneys to whom she has offered legal education and training to be ready for the profession.

She has an extensive proven leadership track record within the profession, with diverse background and knowledge of law from public institutions she has work at, voluntary association she has served in and private practice that she is in.
